A difficult year for cats:

This year there has been an increased demand for space in the shelter.

Unfortunately, more cats than ever have been added to our rehoming waiting list. In the current climate, owners are struggling financially, which has led to an increase in surrendered cats and fewer families coming forward to adopt.

The waiting list for space in the shelter has been high all year. We receive calls daily from owners looking to surrender their cats.

We have rescued many stray cats this year including several pregnant or with kittens.

The reduction in adopters has resulted in a few of our cats waiting for months for their forever home which has a knock-on effect to our waiting list.
